The 8:30 Mass will be a family Mass for Team 1. The children will participate in Children's Liturgy of the Word and be invited to come up to the altar for the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

Parent Session - Raising Kids Catholic in a Challenging Time

The realities facing our families today are very different from when we were children. In an age of youth sports, overwork and sleep debt, technology, political division, and so many other factors, why ought we make time to raise our kids Catholic? Especially now, when revelations of the scope of clerical sexual abuse and failures of leadership among bishops are prominent in news cycles, can we share Catholic faith with our kids with integrity? And what about the pluralism within our families and our communities? Is religious belonging a thing of the past?

Dr. Tim Muldoon, director of mission education at Catholic Extension and a professor of philosophy and theology at Boston College, will reflect on these questions, with particular attention to the challenges of raising kids Catholic in an age of scandal within the Church.

This will be a child only session

Sunday, Nov. 11 Teams 1 and 2 meet for a Parent and Child Personal Safety Session at St. Zepherin Center at 9:30.

Parent and Child Personal Safety Lesson - Our parish is participating in a personal safety and abuse prevention education program for grade one through grade five sponsored by the Archdiocesan Offices of Child Advocacy, Implementation and Oversight, Religious Education, and Catholic Schools. In full appreciation of parents as primary educators of their children, our goal is to partner with parents in providing our children with the best information and skills for personal safety.

Grades K-5 will be participating in the "Stay Safe" Personal Safety Skills Program—a program designed to address safety issues related to the needs of children in these age categories. This program is based on the following elements:

1. Nurturing children's self-esteem
2. Building children's confidence
3. Enabling children to be assertive
4. Helping children to identify and express their feelings
5. Helping children to distinguish between safe and unsafe situations and telling a parent or trusted adult about unsafe situations

This program will be presented in a large group session that includes parents and children. This large group session will be presented Sue Muldoon based on the program developed by Susan Murphy, an experienced religious educator who has designed an effective and age appropriate presentation for children. Parents are asked to attend with their children.

Sunday, November 11, 2012 at 9:30 at St. Zepherin Center

A major component of the Stay Safe Program is parent involvement. At the end of the lesson, the children will bring home worksheets to complete with you at home. Children learn more about safety and are more likely to follow safety guidelines when they have multiple opportunities to practice and talk about safety with their parents and family. Your child learns more from you than anyone else!

Parmenter Foundation

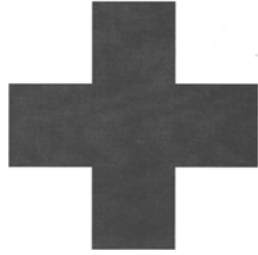

We had many volunteers join us for our visit to the Boston Common over Columbus Day weekend. We distributed food, clothing, and footwear. Our brothers and sisters were so grateful to receive the donations.

One sister who came at the end of our visit asked for assistance with a bus pass to go to a nearby hospital. We were able to help her. She told us that she was beaten the night before and was in pain. Her attacker stole her belongings, except for one shoe. She hobbled to a bench at the Common and sat there crying and praying to God for help. She looked down to discover a bag on the ground. When she opened it, she found a new pair of sneakers in her size! She said that it is scary to live on the streets, but she knows that God is with her. She mentioned that a family member has offered her a place to stay so she is hoping not to see us next month.

Did you know that our ministry accepts donations of dress shirts, dress pants, suits, dresses, and dress shoes? We donate them to the employment program at St. Francis House, a homeless shelter near the Common, to help our brothers and sisters who are trying to secure jobs.

LISTEN, LEARN, LOVE

"Hear, O Israel" (shema yisrael) in today's first reading (Deut 6:2-6) introduces a mantra that became part of Jewish prayer, "The Lord, our God! The Lord, alone/only!" (v. 4). What follows specifies both the complete devotion (heart, being, capability) to the "words" (statutes, laws including the Ten Commandments) which Moses has given to the people and how that is to be achieved. Our Lectionary stops before the instructions for "heart surgery" in practice and provides a thin translation "take to heart" for the Hebrew "be on your heart".

Both ignoring the larger context and the practical instructions plays into a form of Christian anti-Judaism that assumes (falsely) Jesus' intention was to eradicate rather than complete or perfect Moses' Torah instruction. But that devotion to God alone does not take root by simply hearing on a "big rally" occasion any more than love is defined by the initial attraction which drew two people together. In fact it takes a lot of listening and learning to grow into love.

One might even treat the physical embodiments of that single-heartedness stipulated in Deuteronomy a Montessori classroom for God. Its requirements: sing-song recital with the kids along with talking (v. 7), special "Torah wear", the small box around the forehead and a band around the hand (v. 8), and written signs on house doors and gates (v. 9). Physically the word of the Lord moves outward from heart, to voice, to forehead, to hand, to doorpost and finally on the gate. Since Jesus, himself, wore the cloak tassels worn by Jewish males as a reminder of the commandments (Mk 6:56; Num 15:37-41), we should imagine him clothed in other "Torah wear" as well.

Anthropologists can point to other religious which also employ such items as inscribed headgear, bracelets and armbands indicating dedication to a deity, the carving of guardian spirits at Temple gates and on doorways to ward off evil spirits. But for the Jews what might otherwise be confined to special ritual times and spaces has moved into the world of everyday. In fact the reciting and talking are to occur at home, while taking a walk, both when lying down and getting up. People are "wrapped up" in God's Torah (commandments, words, instruction). And in today's gospel, Jesus reassures the scribe who understands that as the reality he and Jesus share, "You are not far from the Kingdom of God" (Mk 12:34).
